

Task Force Uniform Announces Changes

Uniform regulations include skirts, bags

WASHINGTON (NNS) — Task Force Uniform (TFU) has announced some significant changes to the Navy Uniform Regulations, which were recently approved by Chief of Naval Operations (CNO) Adm. Vern Clark. These changes are among the first initiatives being rolled out as a result of Task Force Uniform. The Uniform Regulation changes were made based on fleet input from interviews with Sailors, command site visits, comprehensive research and data collected from a Navywide uniform survey.

The survey collected feedback from more than 40,000 Sailors throughout the fleet.

The approved changes include women's skirts, identification badges, civilian bags, women's handbags, communication devices and breast

Task Force Uniform (TFU) has announced that female Sailors may now wear civilian handbags while in uniform, but must meet specific criteria's and be worn in the manner prescribed in NAVADMIN 209/04. Women's uniform handbags are now an optional uniform item, and will no longer be a prescribed seabag item or issued at recruit training as of Oct. 1, 2004. Other approved changes include women's skirts, identification badges, civilian bags, communication devices and breast insignia.

Navy Ball fetes 229

Tickets for Key West's Navy Ball, scheduled for Friday, Oct. 15, are on sale now! This year's Navy Ball will celebrate the 229th birthday of the United States Navy.

"The Navy Ball is a very popular event here in Key West and it typically sells out," said Lt. Ken Thompson, officer-in-charge of Aircraft

Intermediate Maintenance Detachment Key West and this year's Navy Ball chairman. "Tickets will be sold to only active duty military until Sept. 22. Department of Defense civilians, retirees, and others eligible to attend can buy their tickets after Sept. 22."

Prices for Navy Ball tickets vary depending on pay grade. Enlisted persons E-4 and below will be charged \$15 for their ticket and their guest; enlisted persons E-5 and 6 will be charged \$25; senior enlist-

ed E-7 and above and officers will be charged \$30. Non-military guest tickets cost \$35. Retired Navy guests will pay the price of their rank at retirement.

The Navy Ball will be held at Trumbo Palms from 5:30 p.m. until the band stops playing. The Ball committee guarantees a good time and hopes to see many active duty Key West Sailors and their invited guest or guests. Childcare will be provided at Trumbo Point for a nominal fee and reservations must

be made in advance.

"It was a great Ball last year and we expect this one to be even better," said Thompson. "The guest speaker will be Rear Adm. Red Best, U.S. Navy, (retired). Best is a former NAS Key West commanding officer. His "New Cut Band" will provide the entertainment following dinner and Navy Birthday ceremonies. And if a fun evening isn't enough reason to come to this year's Ball, there will be some great door prizes to be given away."

Start making plans now to attend this year's Navy Ball. The uniform for military members is Dress Whites with miniature medals. Formal attire is required for civilian guests. The Navy Exchange has ordered additional miniature medals to prepare for last minute shopping. "Consigning Adults," a local consignment store at 802 White St., has offered discounts for those purchasing formal wear for the Navy Ball, just ask for the Navy Ball discount.

Staying in shape is a real 'bear'

Hurricane season reminds us of one of the many challenges of living in a place like Key West.

I've discovered one other obvious challenge that Sailors here face every day: a wide array of restaurants and bars. These temptations are choices. You

ultimately decide whether or not to "super size" or have "one more for the road".

The Navy gave me a tool for measuring the health and fitness of its Sailors and officers. That tool is the physical readiness standards.

According to Navy instructions, the mandatory, biannual fitness readiness test was designed for commanding officers to understand and evaluate the health and fitness of the Sailors assigned to them. Looking at a stack of performance evaluations recently, I was surprised at the number of NAS Key West Sailors who failed the fitness test. With the next physical fitness test scheduled for November, the time to prepare is NOW!

If your personal fitness slipped over the summer, don't try to get back into shape too rapidly. The Naval Safety Center cites poor health fitness and

overexertion as one of the leading causes of Sailor's injuries and death, second only to the failure to wear seat belts. Your best course to staying healthy is a regular exercise program. The Morale Welfare and Recreation Department provides excellent fitness facilities at Boca Chica, Sigsbee, Trumbo and soon, Truman Annex, for Sailors to stay healthy.

Experts agree that a 30-minute fitness regime, twice a week will keep you healthy. You still need to watch what you eat. The physical fitness assessment includes measuring body fat. Navy standards require Sailors to pass both portions of the

assessment. I find it alarming that there are Sailors at NAS Key West who pass the body fat portion of the assessment but fail to pass the physical fitness test.

Health is an important safety factor, both for the individual and the Navy. Sailors who eat poorly and are out of shape fatigue quicker than those who are healthy. Fatigue is a killer for those who decide to take short cuts or ignore safety precautions.

In emergency situations, survival rates are higher for healthy and fit people involved in life threatening situations.

Remember the joke of two men being chased by a big bear?

One man stops running and pulls out a pair of running shoes from his backpack. The other guy laughs and asks if he really thought he could out run the bear with running shoes. His partner answered, "I don't have to out run the bear. I just need to out run YOU!"

If you haven't started preparing for the physical readiness assessment, start now! Staying in shape is as important as knowing your rating. You can't advance without passing the physical fitness assessment. Know the standards you need to achieve. Don't be the one who gets passed when a big bear is in the chase.

Three new classes

Improve your leadership skills and techniques

In order to keep up with ever changing leadership roles and improvements to Sailors' development and professionalism, three new classes, the First Line Leadership Development Program (FLLDP), Primary Leadership Development Program (PLDP), and Advanced Leadership Development Program (ALDP) have emerged from the Naval Leadership Training Continuum (NLTC).

Previously, the leadership courses were only available to petty officers in pay grades E-4 to E-7, regardless of the individual's leadership role.

The new classes are designed to better meet the needs of people in leadership positions.

"The classes are now aligned with a Sailor's leadership role in the command vice their pay grade. This will ensure that Sailors are getting required leadership training that is commensurate with their responsibilities," said CMDM (SW) Kraig Holubar, Naval Air Station Key West's command master chief.

"These changes also support the Navy's revolution in training and the move to the 5 Vector Model (5VM)," Holubar added.

The First Line Leadership Development Program (FLLDP) is for Sailors in pay grades E-3 to E-5 who are in a "first leadership position" within their chain of command.

These Sailors are those who are responsible for the growth, development and daily direction of their subordinates.

The Primary Leadership Development Program (PLDP) is for those E-5 to E-6 Sailors who will be assigned leadership roles and responsibilities that include planning and executing divisional functions. They will also be responsible for the professional and personal growth of personnel within their division.

The Advanced Leadership Development Program (ALDP) is for first class petty officers and chief petty officers who are assigned to leadership roles and responsibilities in the adminis-

tration, supervision and training of their division or department, including the professional and personal growth of personnel within that division or department.

According to Holubar, the course curriculum was also significantly modified to include instruction in e-learning.

The new course involves in-class instruction mixed with computer e-learning on the Navy Knowledge Online (NKO) Web site. For this reason, all Sailors assigned must have a NKO account (username and password).

The e-learning portion of the course is done on the NKO Web site, and the students' progress and course completion will be logged directly on the Professional Development vector of the 5VM.

All Sailors must complete FLLDP prior to taking the Navy-wide exam for E-6. However, completion of the E-5 NLTC course satisfies the requirement of FLLDP.

Completion of FLLDP is required for enrollment in PLDP, and PLDP is required to take the Navy wide exam for E-7. Previous completion of the E-6 NLTC satisfies the requirement of PLDP.

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Thetis to return home

The 91 men and women of U.S. Coast Guard Cutter Thetis (WMEC 910) will return home tomorrow after a 66-day patrol in the Caribbean Sea and Florida Straits.

While off the coast of Haiti, Thetis responded to a distress call made by a 30-ft. fishing vessel of the Dominican Republic, the Jeradina. With nightfall rapidly approaching, Thetis launched her small boat into 10-ft. seas. Thetis' engineers tried to fix the vessel's engine, but the starter was broken. After advis-

ing the vessel's captain to let out his anchors, the boat crew returned to Thetis.

At 11:30 p.m., the Jeradina was drifting quickly towards shoal water. Once again, Thetis launched her small boat and arrived on scene, this time to rig a tow. Battling 15-ft. seas and 25-knot winds, Thetis' small boat was able to tow the vessel from 500 yards off the rocky coastline to a safe anchorage area.

The following morning, Thetis supplied the Jeradina with gasoline, food and water, and arranged for a tow.

Thetis also assisted in the repatriation of 65 Cuban migrants. On one calm day, Thetis spotted four men paddling a seven-foot inflatable raft, 40 miles from the Keys. The men were in the middle of a major shipping lane when Thetis rescued them from the sea.

In addition to migrant operations, Thetis kept busy conduct-



ing law enforcement boardings, enforcing international laws and treaties, and conducting helicopter operations and live fire training exercises at sea. Thetis spent the last two weeks of the patrol towing Miami's U.S. Coast

Guard Cutter Gentian, a 180-ft. buoy tender with inoperable engines, to safe waters during Hurricanes Frances and Ivan.

Thetis is a 270-ft. medium endurance cutter homeported in Key West.

insignia.

One of the changes effective immediately will be the authorized wear of civilian bags while in uniform. This includes briefcases, gym bags, backpacks, suitcases and garment bags. The specific guidance on wear and appearance for each is outlined in NAVADMIN 209/04.

Another revision that is effective immediately is the wear of a wireless communication device, such as a cell phone, PDA or pager for official business, while in uniform.

The device cannot be visible from the front, and must be worn on the belt, aft of the right or left elbow. Specific guidance and further details on the proper wearing and use of these devices is contained in NAVADMIN 209/04.

Female Sailors may now wear civilian handbags while in uniform, but must meet the specific criteria and be worn in the manner prescribed in NAVADMIN 209/04. Women's uniform handbags are now an optional uniform item, and will no longer

be a prescribed seabag item or issued at recruit training as of Oct. 1, 2004.

In addition to the handbag, women's skirts will also be an optional uniform component as of Oct. 1, 2004. This applies to both service and dress uniforms, and may no longer be prescribed.

Female Sailors who desire to wear a skirt will still be able to purchase them through the Navy Uniform shop.

There is also new guidance regarding silver breast insignia and identification badges. Specifications are outlined in the NAVADMIN.

"In the fleetwide survey, we asked a lot of detailed questions and received some very detailed responses in return," said Master Chief Petty Officer of the Navy (SS/AW) Terry Scott, who oversaw the massive effort.

TFU is developing concept uniforms for a working uniform for E-1 through O-10, as well as a year-round service uniform for E-6 and below. TFU plans to announce the uniform concepts in the coming weeks.

NAVADMIN 209/04 serves as the interim change to the Navy Uniform Regulations.

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Fishermen – reel that bird in!

Exotic and Wild Bird Rescue (EWBR) of the Florida Keys responded to a call about a bird in distress on Fleming Key and arrived to find an osprey entangled in fishing line and dangling from branches in the mangroves. Sadly, the bird was dead, trapped in the mangroves by fishing line, which had tangled around the branches of the plants. Death does not come easily for birds in this predicament - and it is totally unnecessary. Had the bird been reeled in, the line and hook could have been removed, and the bird would be alive today.

Monofilament fishing line is the number one killer of our wading birds in the Florida Keys. It is extremely important to dispose of mono properly, and if a bird is hooked, please DO NOT CUT the line. Reel the bird in, and if you are not able to remove the line, call Exotic and Wild Bird Rescue at 305-872-1982. EWBR is available 24 hours a day, 7 days a week to assist in wildlife emergencies.

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Navy honors Sept. 11 by naming new ships for Arlington and Somerset

Secretary of the Navy Gordon England named the eighth and ninth ships of the San Antonio-class of Amphibious Transport Dock ships as Arlington and Somerset.

The future USS Arlington and USS Somerset will join USS New York as living tributes to those who suffered in the terrorist attacks of Sept. 11, 2001, and to the nation.

Arlington was chosen to honor the county in northern Virginia, and especially, the 184 victims, aboard American Airlines Flight 77, and on the ground, who died during the Sept. 11 attack on the Pentagon.

Somerset honors the county in Pennsylvania where United Airlines Flight 93 crashed after courageous passengers stormed the cockpit in an attempt to regain control from the terrorists onboard. Their actions prevented the airplane from reaching its destination and inflicting further casualties and damage, and the heroic sacrifice of these 40 passengers and crew rallied and inspired the nation.

In naming these ships, England noted the impact these vessels will have on the terrorist infrastructure that led to their naming. “USS Arlington and USS Somerset will help America project power to the far reaches of the earth and will support the cause of freedom as we engage in the current war on terrorism,”

England said. “The courage and heroism of the people aboard those flights, and in the Pentagon, will never be forgotten by the American people, and as these ships engage in combating terrorism, they will leave a legacy that will never be forgotten by those wishing to do harm to this country.”

Two previous vessels have been named Arlington. The first was a steel-hulled C1B type cargo ship operating during World War II. The second USS Arlington was a 14,500-ton major communications relay ship, originally commissioned in July 1946, which saw heavy use during the Vietnam War, including helping with communications during a June 1969 conference between U.S. President Nixon and Republic of Vietnam President Thieu.

Two previous Navy ships have carried the Somerset name as well. The first Somerset, a wooden-hulled, side-wheel ferryboat, performed blockade duty and made reconnaissance expeditions for the Union, until she was sold at public auction on July 12, 1865.

The Navy acquired the second Somerset, a wooden motorboat built in 1917, on April 10, 1918, under free lease from the Conservation Commission of Maryland. Designated Id. No. 2162, Somerset served on section patrol duty in the Chesapeake Bay area during World War I. After the armistice was signed, she was returned to her owner on Nov. 26, 1918.

The 684-foot-long amphibious transport dock ships will be built by Northrop Grumman Ship Systems in New Orleans and will each carry a Navy crew of 363 and 699 Marines. The ships will be used to transport and land Marines, their equipment and supplies by embarked air cushions or conventional landing craft or amphibious vehicles, augmented by helicopters or vertical take off and landing aircraft in amphibious

assault, special operations, or expeditionary warfare missions.

The ships will also incorporate the latest quality of life standards for the embarked sailors and Marines, including the sit-up berth, ship services mall, a fitness center and learning resource center and electronic classroom with the flexibility to accommodate mixed gender sailors and Marines as part of the crew and embarked troops. The design team also incorporated hundreds of suggestions and recommendations from more than 1,000 sailors and Marines in the design for ownership process to ensure that these ships will meet their needs throughout the first half of the 21st century.

Think back to the last time you volunteered to help someone. Remember that feeling you had inside when the people you helped thanked you? Whatever it is that makes us want to help others, the number of people who give their talents and time to better others and their communities is astonishing.

Last year, more than 63 million Americans served as volunteers according to the U.S. Department of Labor. That number equates to 28.8 percent of all Americans. As high as that percentage is, I have a feeling it's even higher in the Navy.

Almost 40 percent of those Americans who volunteered reported they did so because someone asked them to volunteer. In the Navy, I'd guess that almost all of us have been asked to volunteer, in one form or another.

In most commands, our chaplains manage aggressive programs to provide assistance in our communities. I know for a fact they often publish POD notes asking Sailors to give some time for various causes. The nice thing about this is they do most of the work for you. All you have to do is sign up and show up.

So what kinds of things do Sailors volunteer for? The list is endless, but some of the most common things are coaching, refereeing, tutoring, teaching, ushering, providing time to Boy Scouts, Girl Scouts, Boy's Club, etc. In the end, I don't think it's as important what we volunteer for as it is that we just volunteer. Each of us has unique talents and when we share them we make our neighborhoods and communities better.

I'm sure you have heard leaders talk to you about giving something back to the communities we live in. Most of us in the Navy are somewhat transient, meaning we live in a city for a period of years and then move on.

While that is true, I truly believe we have an obligation to give something back to the communities we live in. I'm a firm believer that we in the Navy serve twice, once to our country and once to our community. Considering how easy it is to contribute, there aren't many excuses we can come up with that hold water.

I'm a firm believer that we in the Navy serve twice, once to our country and once to our community.

According to the Department of Labor, the main reasons people do not volunteer are, lack of time, lack of health, and family responsibilities. I can appreciate all of these, but the Navy offers almost every person some unique ways to volunteer that will have little to no impact on your personal life. Consider the adopt-a-school program.

Most commands that participate in this program allow Sailors to volunteer during the workday. There are many more examples of this, but my point is simple.

If you really want to volunteer, there are many ways for you to do it that fit in with your lifestyle. The challenge is for you to just decide to give some of your time and talent to others.

For those of you who volunteer on a regular basis and provide consistent support to

organizations and your communities, I'd like to talk a minute about the Navy's formal recognition program for volunteers. Just more than a decade ago the military introduced the Military Outstanding Volunteer Service Medal (MOVSM).

The medal was designed to recognize those who perform outstanding volunteer community service of a sustained direct and consequential nature.

To qualify for the MOVSM, Sailors' volunteer service must meet the following criteria:

- Be to the civilian community, to include the military family community.
- Be significant in nature and produce tangible results.
- Reflect favorably on the

Military Service and the Department of Defense.

- Be of sustained and direct nature.

The thing to keep in mind is the MOVSM is not intended to recognize a single act of achievement. It takes sustained service to be eligible.

I offer this to you because I sometimes hear of Sailors who have been volunteering for years, but didn't know the Navy had a formal recognition program.

If you think you qualify, talk to your chain of command. They have the instruction and understand how to do the application.

Volunteering is a wonderful thing. Whether you are a Seaman or an Admiral, there are

ways for you to give of your time and talent to help others. The Navy places a lot of stock in volunteering. It's often considered in performance evaluations, Sailor of the Quarter/Year programs, and for command histories. The only thing I would ask is that if you volunteer, you do so for the right reasons. Helping others is an honorable thing to do as long as you are giving of your time to truly help, and not just make yourself look good.

Shipmates, please consider how you might volunteer to help others. The feeling you get when you do something nice for others is priceless and the more you do it, the better you feel. Thank you to every one of you who give so much to so many!

ment in ALDP, and ALDP is required for advancement to E-8. Previous completion of the E-7 NLTC course satisfies the requirement of ALDP.

Written authorization from the first flag officer in the chain of command is needed to waive any of the above requirements, but according to Holubar, waivers are difficult to justify and normally not approved.

Members of the Mobile Training Team (MTT) from Mayport, Fla., teach the courses.

There is a waiting list, and classes are limited to 24 people. MTT Mayport determines the yearly number and schedule of classes based on the southeast region area population.

Sailors who meet the criteria and need to attend one of the courses must contact their departmental training coordinator as soon as possible.

Holubar said supervisors must consider the importance of the class and nightly homework assignments, and not over task the students who are in attendance.

"Parent commands must

ensure that students attending leadership courses are not assigned duties which interfere with the conduct of the course," Holubar said. "Attendance at class and completion of homework are considered primary duties while Sailors are attending LDP."

Mother nature could put mission on hold


TALLAHASSEE, Fla. - If Hurricane Ivan strikes Florida this week, members of the Florida National Guard Counterdrug Reconnaissance and Aerial Interdiction Detachment team will put aside their counterdrug duties, briefly, to capture images of a different sort; images of destruction caused by Mother Nature.

According to Florida National Guard RAID commander Capt. Brett Rhodenizer, OH-58 RAID helicopters will fly over the heavily damaged areas using Forward Looking Infrared, T.V., and low-light cameras immediately after the storm passes.

Once the images are uploaded by the crew, the video can be directly fed to the State Emergency Operations Center in Tallahassee, allowing the appropriate emergency agencies to prioritize and allocate resources as necessary based on the observations, said Rhodenizer.

Currently, various agencies such as Federal Emergency Management Agency, State Emergency Response Team and numerous military support organizations are manning the State EOC in the wake of both Hurricanes Charley and Frances.

Now faced with a third hurri-

cane and the ensuing aftermath, the surveillance footage could prove highly beneficial to the emergency response agencies given the double blows Florida has received during the past month.

According to emergency response officials, if the RAID teams are used for the damage surveillance, it will mark the first time live footage has been used by the State EOC. During normal operations, the RAID teams work in direct support of law enforcement agencies, using the various imaging technology to record

drug activities throughout the state. If the RAID teams are tasked for the hurricane, Rhodenizer stated that if called upon, the Hurricane Ivan reconnaissance mission will not impact the counterdrug mission.

"Even dopers won't go out in a hurricane," he said. The Guard's counterdrug operation in Florida has four OH-58s, ensuring there will still be enough manning to thwart drug or terrorist activities. The counterdrug mission will still thrive, even if parts of Florida are blasted by the wrath of Ivan.

Sailors allowed flexibility for exam deadlines

FROM CHIEF OF NAVAL PERSONNEL PUBLIC AFFAIRS

WASHINGTON (NNS) — Commanders may request the administration of substitute exams through Naval Education and Training Professional Development and Technology Center (NETPDTC) when mission requirements keep Sailors

from taking a test by the scheduled date.

NETPDTC will consider all requests, even those submitted after published deadlines, to ensure all eligible Sailors have an opportunity to take their exam.

“Commanders have the latitude to administer substitute exams when operational tempo legitimately interferes with Sailors preparing for or taking the exams on the scheduled date,” said Lt. Cmdr. Juliet Cook, the Navy’s advancement planner for the Chief of Naval Personnel. “NETPDTC considers all requests, even those submitted after deadlines, to ensure our Sailors have a fair opportunity to take an exam.”

Valid reasons for request-

ing substitute exams include emergency leave, sick in quarters or hospitalization, and operational commitments, especially deployed units in combat areas.

Cook spoke of a recent example of a forward-deployed hospital corpsman that had his exam forwarded from detachment to detachment for about six weeks. The Sailor was finally able to take the exam in July, four months after the scheduled March exam date.

If a Sailor, such as this corpsman, takes a delayed exam with coordination and approval by NETPDTC, the answer sheet is scanned and scored for advancement and the Sailor, if eligible, will receive backdated pay and time-in-rate.




